## SARASWATI VIDYA SADHANA YOJANA (Science Stream Support)

**Eligibility: Std 10 students who score 50% or more in board exams may benefit from this scheme for Science stream in Std 11-12.**

- Std 10 students studying in GSHSEB or CBSE schools in Gujarat may apply.
- If they score 50% or more in board exams, they are eligible.
- Each beneficiary receives a total of Rs. 30,000 per year.
- Std 9 & 10 students scoring 50% in annual exams from private school may also benefit.
- Students must be studying in the same school they applied from.
- After Std 10, completing 2 years in Std 11 earns them the benefit. Students from Std 9 earn the benefit in the 3rd year.
